The last few weeks have seen several changes at Wareham Hospital which have been welcomed by the Friends as they show investment and development in the Hospital to promote and extend Purbeck services:

- Reorganisation of clinic rooms to provide the Podiatry service on the ground floor
- Re-modelling of rooms on the first floor to provide a clinic space for a children and young people's eating disorder service
- Work on rooms for the Child and Adolescent Mental Health Crisis liaison service
- Plans are progressing to recommence Covid vaccinations for over 75's and those immunosuppressed from early April 2023 for an eight week period
- The start of a new Breathlessness Clinic run by Lewis Manning hospice care\*\*
- A post-Covid syndrome service is hoping to start face to face clinics in the near future

Also we are delighted that the newly appointed CEO of Dorset Healthcare /Dorset County Hospital, Matthew Bryant, who officially starts his new role in April has already made plans to visit the hospital and meet with the Friends committee in the near future which we trust will be a positive time.

*"I returned to Swanage for a break last summer and was thrilled that the Mowlem was still showing movies. Standing in the auditorium again was a very pleasant experience, and I hope to be down again soon. I am proud to be a patron; I'm a film director now, but I never stopped being a film-goer. Keep up the great work."*

The appointment of a Patron for The Mowlem Theatre was an aspiration stated in our 2022 Business Plan but not one we imagined would be fulfilled so quickly. Finding a Patron with an incredible catalogue of work and a genuine connection to Swanage and The Mowlem goes far beyond what we had envisaged.

On a more serious note, the Town Clerk and I attended the South-East Purbeck Parish and Town Clerks' and Chairs' meeting at Studland and will be working with a group of other Parish Councillors to discuss how to manage the effects of tourism on the Isle of Purbeck.

The Deputy Mayor and I left the Isle of Purbeck to enjoy the environs of Kingston Maurward for the Dorset Council networking conference where we learnt a lot, shivered a lot, but also enjoyed the lunch a lot! It is very useful to hear the problems that we all face in our communities, and how we can better work together within local government to overcome them.

I also visited St George's School in Langton Matravers with Cllr Bonfield to present a certificate to the winner of the Coast Forum logo competition, which was a joy.

## All hands to the mine!

The engineers have been fine-tuning the locomotives and greasing the points, the collections team has been reinstalling and cataloguing exhibits, the electricians have been testing the display equipment and the decorators have been sprucing up many of the buildings. All of the volunteers at the Purbeck Mining Museum have been working hard to prepare the venue for the 2023 season which looks set to be the busiest year yet.

The museum's full 2023 opening schedule begins on **Good Friday (7<sup>th</sup> April)**, but the venue will also be open on the **24<sup>th</sup>-26<sup>th</sup> March** to coincide with the influx of visitors during the Swanage Railway Steam Gala. This will provide visitors with demonstrations of engine and wagon movements along the reinstated narrow-gauge railway as well as the opportunity to see all of the exhibits and displays in the main museum building. Further demonstration days are planned throughout the summer season – full details will be available at <http://purbeckminingmuseum.org>.

As well as clearing scrub and weeds along the narrow-gauge track bed, the Museum's team of volunteers has also been preparing for the installation of a new welfare facility adjacent to the restored clay mine and clearing undergrowth for new nature trails through the 25 acres of woodland around the museum. This work follows confirmation of grant funding to enable visitors to enjoy a leisurely walk around the rewilded area adjacent to Purbeck Park.

Footpaths and interpretation boards will be constructed through the woodland, that has remained untouched for over half a century. Viewpoints looking towards Corfe Castle and across Blackwater Lake are also being created as well as a small number of picnic areas to enable visitors to spend an enjoyable day at Norden finding out more about the area's industrial past and spotting local wildlife along the woodland trails.

The Purbeck Mining Museum is extending opening times this year and is always looking for new volunteers with a wide range of skills who have an interest in local history and the local ecology and who enjoy meeting people. ## “As a family, through ‘Nature Tots’, we fell in love with Studland” says Mum



“Both my daughters and I attended the first ever ‘Nature Tots’ session on Dunes Day 2021 and the second session during the Planet Purbeck Festival in September 2021, both ably led by Julia Galbenu and her team of volunteers. By the time regular sessions started up on Monday mornings in October 2021, my daughters and I had fallen in love with Studland and attending ‘Nature Tots’ were an absolute must in our weekly routine.

“When the need arose, I found myself leading a session or two. At Julia's suggestion, I have since become a National Trust volunteer and I have led and will continue to lead ‘Nature Tots’ sessions on a rotary basis with 3 brilliant volunteers: Katherine, Pam and Christine.



“As a family, attending the Nature Tots sessions has encouraged a wonder and appreciation of our local area. Walking through the woods is fun throughout the year and we love observing the changes in nature through the seasons. The crafts we do are always interesting and really help the kids engage all their senses and get their hands into nature.

“We love the unique variety of habitats that Studland offers and I love the challenge of choosing what to do on the sessions I will lead. In Winter, if it is sunny we are on the beach, building sandcastles, stacking stones, playing hide and seek in the dunes, marking the tide as long as the dogs leave our stick in the sand alone! If it is wet and/or windy, into the woods we head.

We generally forage natural items for a set purpose, for example, to make different sounds with; to build dens; to create mud faces, fairy potions; to make nature bracelets, crowns, wands, homes for little woodland folk. It is fascinating watching the kids imagination run free. The adults have a lot of fun too! It is a lovely hour or so where we can get away from the bustle of parenting and just enjoy the great outdoors with our little ones. My daughters and I more often than not stay in Studland after the sessions are officially over which greatly helps us with our 1000 hours outside challenge. We have enjoyed many adventures in Studland and created some really special memories.

“We all love that Nature Tots is free and open to all little ones and their parents or guardians. Getting families into the great outdoors and encouraging a love of nature is vital if we are all to play our part in nature conservation. Nature Tots is hugely significant in getting kids into nature from a very young age.

**“As an individual, Nature Tots at Studland has given me new friends, another way to bring nature into my life, an opportunity to give back as a volunteer and is helping develop my self confidence as I lead sessions. Nature Tots at Studland has taken me and my family, on a journey we never anticipated but will always be grateful for. Vasi Pillay**

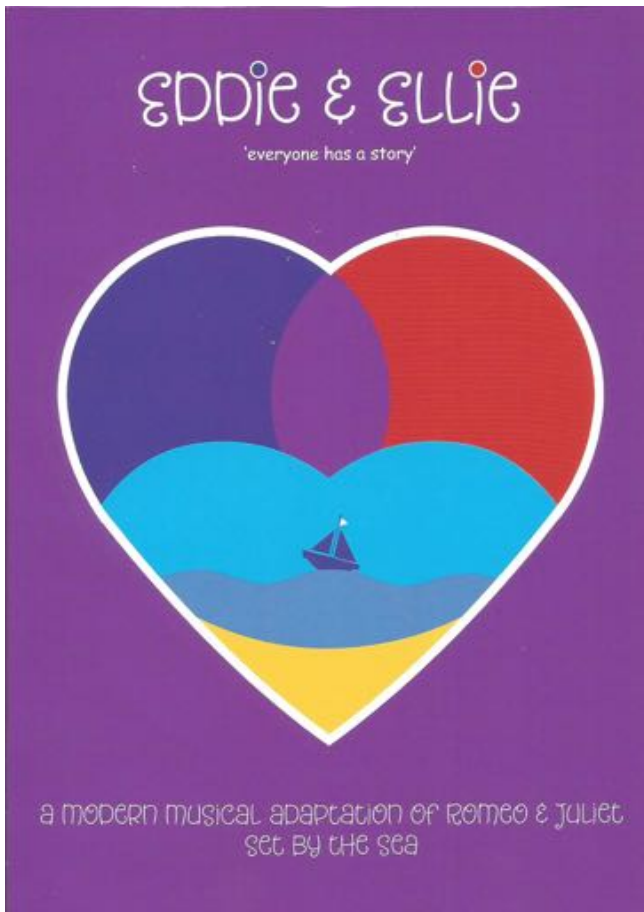

## News from Corfe Castle Parish Council

**Notes from our March meeting:** During the public half hour, one member of the public came to stress his concern about the introduction of 5G and its possible effect on health. A second member of the public wanted to draw the Parish Council's attention to the proposed road repairs in West Street in May as there was a lot of concern on the community Facebook page.

The notification of the West Street works came too late to be included on the agenda, but the Parish Council has arranged a delivery to every affected household. The issue was raised with Cllr Cherry Brooks our DC representative and Cllr Brooks was asked about the lack of notification to residents by DC. She agreed to investigate. Residents who are concerned should contact Dorset Council on the phone number or web link shown on the letter.

**Other projects:** The Parish Council had 8 reports from Councillors on projects they are involved in on behalf of the Council. (Southeast Parish's Meeting; Purbeck Community Rail Partnership; Kings Coronation; 20mph speed limit; Environment Group; Cost of Living Support; Litter Free Purbeck; Purbeck Heaths NNR Sustainable Transport Meeting.)

The Council wanted to give special thanks to the litter team and the Swanage led team which had removed rubbish from the A351, and the Kings Coronation project team who have produced a great programme described elsewhere.

Good progress is also being made on the cost-of-living help scheme. The Environment group has had a well attended programme and more talks are planned.

The Council will express its concern to Swanage Railway over the proposed high fares on the new train service to Wareham. The return fare from Corfe to Wareham is £10 and £25 from Swanage to Wareham. Currently until 30 June the bus fare on the no 40 is only £2 for a single ticket. The Council is worried that the pilot scheme will be deemed a failure.

The Council received a highly satisfactory report from its internal auditor for the last quarter.

**Dorset Council Report:** The main headline is that Dorset Council was able to use the savings from the merging of the six councils four years ago to safeguard services and remain financially stable. The precept for its own services is going up 2% compared with inflation of 10% and is a lower increase than permitted by the Government.

**Annual Parish Meeting: Monday 22nd May 7pm, in the Corfe Castle Village Hall, main hall. This is your chance to hear what your Parish Council has achieved over the past year, and through your questions and comments help set the agenda for the Parish Council for the coming year. We will also have short presentations from some of the village organisations on current projects.**

**Planning application & Treework application update:** The following applications have been received by Corfe Castle Parish Council, for full details including proposed works please see the Dorset Council website:

**Application No: P/FUL/2023/00702**, Location: Castle View Information Centre A351 St Edwards Bridge to Norden Roundabout, Corfe Castle Dorset BH20 5DR

**Recommend:** No objection. This application is part of the National Trust's zero carbon policy. There are no visual aspects as the machinery is close to the building and cannot be seen from the castle.

**Application No: P/FUL/2023/01023**, Peake House, Valley Road, BH20 5HT.

**Recommend:** No objection. Corfe Castle Parish Council strongly support the application. Peake House was originally built in the early 20th century as a domestic property for family use. In 2005 it was converted to bed and breakfast use and in 2007 it became a boarding house for Purbeck View School in Swanage. The Council objected to this change of use and the PDC Planning Officer recommended refusal. However, the application was approved by the PDC planning board. The present proposal will return the house to its original domestic use. We strongly support returning it to domestic use as this has been its function for the far greater part of its life.

**Application No: P/CLP/2023/00948**, Location: 25 East Street, BH20 5EE.

**Recommend:** No comment as we do not feel we are qualified to make comment.

To submit a letter to Dorset Council planning department requesting: given the age of the original application (1987) that the application be revisited, as it is believed the application would not be approved today.

It was noted the loading bay which has been installed since the original application was submitted does not show on the plans.

It was stated as the General Store now has a Post Office facility within the shop, the shop owners who live in the flat above, are not able to access the store once the store has closed. Due to this the only way to exit the building is through the storage area / garage; if there were to be a fire in this area there is no alternative fire exit.

# RUBBISH SPRING CLEANS

Litter Free Purbeck, together with all of its constituent groups, is now well established. The groups focus on local areas, usually parish by parish. There are two groups in Swanage; the Beach Buddies, and Swanage Landers which tries to look after the urban areas. We are desperate to recruit new volunteers for Swanage Landers; which meets on the 4th Saturday of the month at 0915hrs and at other times by arrangement. Litter picking on roads with a national speed limit requires a separate Safety Management System, led by Swanage Army Link, with increased measures to mitigate the risks. These include: full Personal Protective Equipment (full orange clothing), very early starts (anytime after 0200hrs) or at weekends, signage, beacons & bollards, and small well briefed teams who know our local roads - who understand the bend & dips which reduce visibility. For example we know that the most dangerous stretches of the A351 are Castle - Norden, @ Halfway, Nursery rail bridge - Ponderosa (on approach to Harmans Cross).

During that past month Studland - Ulwell, Swanage - Stoborough roundabout and Castle - Ulwell Rd (Studland) have all been covered - both sides of the roads. I hope we can cover Langton - Corfe inc Worth before the grass gets growing. Items that we pick up can be surprising, and it's staggering that tossers can be out littering within hours of our voluntary efforts. Yesterday Lara M-B and I did Currendon Hill; within 4 hours there were 8 items of litter on the tarmac...

As a general reminder Dorset Council, have almost totally withdrawn from litter picking. In Wareham there was an employee called Charlie who covered the town centre for many years. He retired last year, and has not been replaced (unfortunately he also passed away a month after finishing work, which was extremely sad news at the time)

There are almost no professional teams picking up litter in Purbeck with the exception of staff provided by parishes, including those Swanage, Wareham and Corfe Castle, the NT, staff at Durlston Country Park.

The solution: STOP TOSSING LITTER, and report those who do to Dorset Council (home page) / Bins recycling & litter / Street cleaning & litter problems / Report litter on the pavement, highway, or thrown from a vehicle. Please do report the litter tossers.
